**VISA AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

Most foreign nationals require a valid passport to enter Brazil for tourist purposes. Exceptions to this rule are nationals of the following countries who may also present the Civil Identity Card: **Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay.**

For VISA application, please contact directly **Brazilian Embassies** located in your country. Please kindly be advised that information concerning Visa-exempt entry is announced on Portal Consular – Ministry of Foreign Affairs’ website and duplicated as follows:

<b>Countries eligible for Visa-exempt entry:</b>	Argentina, Barbados, Bahamas, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Honduras, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Suriname, Guatemala, Guyana, Trinidad and Tobago, Uruguay - Visa Exemption, for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days.  Venezuela (Visa Exemption, for a period not exceeding sixty (60) days).
<b>Visa Required</b>	Antigua and Barbuda, Belize, Cuba, Dominica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Grenada, Haiti, Jamaica, Mexico, Nicaragua, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines.
